






The Lau vs. Nichols case in 1974 did not just offer the English learners with linguistic and curricular support through alternative language programs but opened the doors for the schools to start and expand the Korean Language classes and the Korean Dual Immersion Language Programs (KDIP). The workshop presentation will include how the Korean language programs evolved and a variety of resources that are in place to help sustain the popular programs such as the KDIP. Sample Korean lessons that incorporate the Korean American ethnic studies and technology pertinent to teaching Korean and Korean culture will be presented as well. Dr. Suzie Oh will share her experience as the first and pioneer Korean bilingual teacher in 1975 in the wake of Lau vs. Nichols landmark decision. She will then focus on the role of principals at the elementary school levels to support the programs. Additionally, she will share her experiences as university supervisor for Secondary School Teacher Candidates who work on California Single Credential World Language Korean credential. Ms. Sung Soon Kim will include a presentation on the IKEN curriculum and online resources which incorporate these subjects. Ms. Ellen Park will share her experiences and knowledge on beginning and sustaining successful dual immersion programs as a principal and former dual immersion teacher.

Children are saying "Birds have nests, and people have roots". Bridging individualistic school culture and the value system at home will strengthen the learner-centered model and commit to the "Every Student Succeeds" Act (ESSA). In my presentation, I begin by defining culture (surface and deep culture elements), and then I will discuss contrasting beliefs, values, and practices between traditional Asian and mainstream U.S. cultures. I will examine Cambodian culture and etiquette. I will conclude by offering recommendations on how to provide support to Cambodian students in the classroom to teachers and administrators from a Cambodian parent's perspective.

Environmental print (EP) is the print we see in our environment (e.g., street names). EP is a familiar resource for teaching foundational reading skills (e.g., sight words) to bilinguals in English and in Mandarin. Participants of this break-out session will 1) learn about different types of EP in Mandarin and in English; 2) identify different types of words in EP (e.g., single syllable, multisyllable words, words sharing a same radical, nouns, words with multiple meanings); 3) complete word sorting activities with EP in Mandarin and English; and 4) design their own word sorting activities for their students.

The primary focus of this workshop will be on the integration and use of instructional methods to enhance students' Mandarin literacy development within the context of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) units. This will be achieved through the utilization of diverse texts and multimedia resources in immersion classrooms catering to kids from Kindergarten to 3rd Grade. The instructional tools have been developed in accordance with the Common Core ELA literacy requirements, Next Generation Science Standards, ACTFL Proficiency Guideline, and Project Based Learning approaches encompassing both English and Mandarin languages. The workshop presenters will provide attendees with insights into curriculum design, the integration of STEAM and literacy, and the establishment of routine and structure within lesson plans. Additionally, they will address the effective delivery of curriculum on a daily basis. The presenters, who possess expertise in various roles within the instructional team from the Philistine Rondo School of Discovery such as Principal, Mandarin Immersion TOSA, and Mandarin teachers from different grade levels, will engage in an in-depth exploration and facilitation of the discussion. This will involve addressing two key areas: a) the concerns and challenges faced by educators in effectively balancing and bridging the development of literacy skills with subject content, and b) the implementation of effective strategies to enhance students' literacy learning.

This workshop revolves around empowering literacy in dual language for Tagalog speakers in a transformative initiative, aimed at fostering linguistic proficiency and cultural pride. This educational approach recognizes the significance of bilingualism, seamlessly integrating Tagalog and English to enhance communication skills and cognitive abilities. By embracing a dual language model, learners gain not only linguistic fluency but also a deeper connection to their heritage. The curriculum incorporates culturally relevant content, encouraging a sense of belonging and instilling confidence in learners. Beyond linguistic competence, this approach equips individuals with the tools to navigate a globalized world while preserving the richness of their linguistic identity.
